Applicants for tickets requests must be a non-profit organization, human service agency, service club, or city-run recreation program.

Tickets may not be used for resale; however, they may be used as part of a fund-raising auction. Their use is

intended only to create opportunities for populations with limited access to arts programs, including those populations with limited economic and socio-cultural circumstances, disability, age or other limiting factors.

No organization may request more than 20 tickets at one time for any performance or exhibition. For those requesting tickets to be used for fund-raising auctions, no more than four tickets will be given for any one performance or exhibition.

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## Next Federation Happening 'Jewelry and Judaism' Dec. 5

Jewelry designer and artist Felicia Berg, Rebbetzin Meira Davis, and S.E. Focal Point/Meyerhoff Senior Center Executive Director Frieda Caldes, will be among those hosting "Jewelry and Judaism," second program in the Broward County Jewish Federation's "Hollywood Holiday Happenings" series.

During the Dec. 5 program at two private homes in Hollywood, Berg will teach the women how to make beaded bracelets while Davis, the wife of Rabbi Ed Davis of Young Israel Synagogue of Hollywood-Fort Lauderdale, will speak about "Jewish Gems," the biblical perspective on jewelry.

Caldes will present an overview on the Meyerhoff Senior Center, a Federation beneficiary agency. Separate programs are scheduled from 10:30 a.m. until noon and from 7:30-9 p.m. with cost to attend at \$18.

The program's mitzvah (good deeds) project will be the making of beaded bracelets as Chanukah gifts for the Meyerhoff seniors. Chaired by Lori Ben-Ezra and Elayna Weisel, the three-part series kicked off in September with a cooking demonstration by famed chef Allen Susser. It will conclude with a community-wide Purim Carnival in March.
